PREVIOUS MEETINGS

FUTURE MEETINGS

As anticipated, Trinity School will not be available for the proposed Surplus Equipment Sale at the March A meeting (1st). There will instead be a Zoom based Construction Roundup Part 2 - a follow up to December's Construction Roundup which seemed to be well received, and in which time ran out before all the potential exhibits could be displayed.

The April A meeting (5th) will be the Annual General Meeting, for which the obligatory Calling Notice is presented at the end of this Newsletter. As stated in the Calling Notice, it is expected that this will be held via Zoom (as was the last AGM) but in the event that Trinity is again available it will be held face to face, and members will be notified accordingly.

The May A meeting will be held on the 10th rather than the 3rd as the 1st Monday is a Bank Holiday. It will be a presentation by the Chris G4IFX of the UK Six Metre Group – well timed for the approach of the summer sporadic E season. SRCC CLUB "BEYOND EXAMS" SCHEME

I am sure many of you will have heard about the RSGB scheme known as "Beyond Exams". Actually, there are two schemes, one intended for individuals and one for clubs. The Individual Scheme is all about personal development and building skills on your own. The scheme consists of 150 activities ranging from simple to advanced, based around nine themes. You will receive virtual rewards as you complete activities and gain experience. The Club Scheme provides a framework to allow club members to explore the hobby in a fun and sociable way. The scheme consists of 23 activities, based around five themes. As you go through the scheme and complete activities successfully, you will receive certificates to reward your progress. SRCC is now an RSGB Accredited Club and Club Members are invited to join the scheme. Any SRCC Member my join the RSGB Individual Scheme or the SRCC Club Scheme or both.

Any SRCC Member who wants to join the SRCC Club Scheme must agree to abide by the following Conditions for Use and Rules:

- 1> The Scheme is published by the RSGB for anyone to use for hobby purposes only.
- 2> This work is licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution-Non-commercial-No Derivatives 4.0 International License.
- 3> The Scheme is suitable for use only by adults (age 18 or over in the UK) except where authorised and fully supervised by a parent or guardian.
- 4> Please note that you take part in the suggested activities solely at your own risk and cost.
- 5> The Beyond Exams Club Scheme is a list of suggestions for you to explore the hobby, with some simple virtual rewards for when you do. If you don't know exactly what's involved in any activity, then please research it first. If you are unsure of your abilities get some help from someone who knows about what you want to do!
- 6> Many of the activities require an amateur radio licence and/or other permissions. It is entirely your responsibility to ensure that you have those in place before doing activities that require them.
- 7> The RSGB and SRCC do not have control over what you do within, or with, the suggested activities and therefore cannot accept any responsibility for your actions or consequences of them. 8> Only activities started on or after 1st January 2020 may be counted as activities under this scheme and can contribute to awards.
- 9> Some personal information will be shared and/or transmitted by publication in Newsletters, Magazines, Websites and other social media or cloud services.

10> The Member must forward a request by email to the Club Coordinator to become part of the Club Scheme.

11> The Club Coordinator will forward by email an Excel Spreadsheet form that must be used to record the Member's achievements. The layout and document name must not be changed by the Member.

12> If there are any changes to the Member's achievements since the last submission and the Member wishes to submit the details, then the Excel Spreadsheet form should be sent by email to the Club Coordinator by the 15th of the following month and results will be published in the subsequent Newsletter and forwarded to the RSGB as appropriate.

13> If you don't agree with these conditions and rules then please don't take part in the Scheme - the choice is entirely yours.

And finally....if you claim an Award when you haven't done an activity then the only person being cheated is you! Enjoy and have fun!

EM FIELD EXPOSURE

Ofcom has decided to include a specific condition in Wireless Telegraphy Act licences requiring all licensees to comply with the ICNIRP general public limits on EMF exposure. This condition will apply to amateur licences and a draft of the proposed regulations has been released as part of Ofcom's second consultation document.

The RSGB has submitted its response including detailed comments and suggested amendments to this second EMF consultation and is continuing to prepare guidance to help radio amateurs to assess compliance and keep the necessary records. They have developed an additional front sheet in the RSGB/Ofcom calculator to calculate your EIRP from practical station parameters.
